## **EDUCATION LAW 2-d RIDER**

New York State Education Law 2-d was enacted in 2014 to address concerns relative to securing certain personally identifiable information. In order to comply with the requirements of Education Law 2-d, educational agencies and certain third-party contractors who contract with educational agencies must take certain additional steps to secure such data.

MathBits.com is a private company that sells resources to teachers they may use in their classroom. We do not collect or store any student data for our resources. On Interactive activities, teachers may request that a student complete an assignment with results sent to the teacher. When a student starts the activity, he/she enters his/her name and the email address of the teacher. When completed (or the student closes the browser) the student name disappears, is gone from our site and not is recorded in any manner.

"Protected Data" includes any information rendered confidential by State or federal law, including, but not limited to student data, student demographics, scheduling, attendance, grades, health and discipline tracking, and all other data reasonably considered to be sensitive or confidential data by the District. Protected Data also includes any information protected under Education Law 2-d including, but not limited to:

"Personally identifiable information" from student records of the District as that term is defined in § 99.3 of FERPA,

-AND-

Personally identifiable information from the records of the District relating to the annual professional performance reviews of classroom teachers or principals that is confidential and not subject to release under the provisions of Education Law §§3012-c and 3012-d.

Since MathBits.com does not receive, collect or hold any student data, nor any teacher data pertaining to an annual performance review, MathBits.com does not have any" Protected Data" to preserve.
