## WISCONSIN STUDENT DATA PRIVACY AGREEMENT

## School District/Local Education Agency: Hudson School District

AND

Provider: Apex Learning Inc.

This Wisconsin Student Data Privacy Agreement ("DPA") is entered into by and between the School District of Hudson (hereinafter referred to as "LEA") Apex Learning Inc. (hereinafter referred to as "Provider") on July 1, 2020. The Parties agree to the terms as stated herein.

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Provider has agreed to provide the Local Education Agency ("LEA") with certain digital educational services ("Services") pursuant to a contract dated on or about the same date as this DPA ("Service Agreement").

WHEREAS, in order to provide the Services described in the Service Agreement, the Provider may receive or create, and the LEA may provide documents or data that are covered by several federal statutes, among them, the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act ("FERPA") at 20 U.S.C. 1232g and 34 CFR Part 99, Children's Online Privacy Protection Act ("COPPA"), 15 U.S.C. 6501-6506; Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment ("PPRA") 20 U.S.C. 1232h; and

WHEREAS, the documents and data transferred from LEAs and created by the Provider's Services are also subject to Wisconsin state student privacy laws, including pupil records law under Wis. Stat. § 118.125 and notice requirements for the unauthorized acquisition of personal information under Wis. Stat. § 134.98; and

WHEREAS, for the purposes of this DPA, Provider is a school district official with legitimate educational interests in accessing educational records pursuant to the Service Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to enter into this DPA to ensure that the Service Agreement conforms to the requirements of the privacy laws referred to above and to establish implementing procedures and duties; and

**WHEREAS**, the Provider may, by signing the "General Offer of Privacy Terms" (Exhibit "E"), agree to allow other LEAs in Wisconsin the opportunity to accept and enjoy the benefits of this DPA for the Services described herein, without the need to negotiate terms in a separate DPA.

**NOW THEREFORE**, for good and valuable consideration, the parties agree as follows:

#### ARTICLE I: PURPOSE AND SCOPE

- 1. <u>Purpose of DPA</u>. The purpose of this DPA is to describe the duties and responsibilities to protect student data transmitted to Provider from LEA pursuant to the Service Agreement, including compliance with all applicable statutes, including the FERPA, PPRA, COPPA, and applicable Wisconsin law, all as may be amended from time to time. In performing the Services, the Provider shall be considered a School District Official with a legitimate educational interest, and performing services otherwise provided by the LEA. With respect to the use and maintenance of Student Data, Provider shall be under the direct control and supervision of the LEA.
- **2.** <u>Nature of Services Provided</u>. The Services that the Provider has agreed to provide are described in <u>Exhibit "A"</u>:
- 3. <u>Student Data to Be Provided</u>. The Parties shall indicate the categories of student data to be provided in the Schedule of Data, attached hereto as <u>Exhibit</u> "B".

**4. <u>DPA Definitions</u>**. The definition of terms used in this DPA is found in <u>Exhibit</u> "C". In the event of a conflict, definitions used in this DPA shall prevail over term used in the Service Agreement.

## ARTICLE II: DATA OWNERSHIP AND AUTHORIZED ACCESS

- 1. Student Data Property of LEA. All Student Data transmitted to the Provider pursuant to the Service Agreement is and will continue to be the property of and under the control of the LEA or the student or parent/guardian who provided such data. The Provider further acknowledges and agrees that all copies of such Student Data transmitted to the Provider, including any modifications or Student Data additions or any portion thereof from any source, are subject to the provisions of this Agreement in the same manner as the original Student Data. The Parties agree that as between them, all rights, including all intellectual property rights in and to Student Data transmitted to the Provider per the Service Agreement shall remain the exclusive property of the LEA or the student or parent/guardian who provided such data. For the purposes of FERPA, the Provider shall be considered a School District Official, under the control and direction of the LEAs as it pertains to the use of Student Data notwithstanding the above. Provider may transfer pupil-generated content to a separate account, according to the procedures set forth below.
- 2. Parent Access. LEA shall establish reasonable procedures by which a parent, legal guardian, or eligible student may review Student Data in the pupil's records, correct erroneous information, and procedures for the transfer of pupil-generated content to a personal account, consistent with the functionality of the Services. Provider shall respond in a timely manner (and no later than 30 days from the date of the request) to the LEA's request for Student Data in a pupil's records held by the Provider to view or correct as necessary. In the event that a parent of a pupil or other individual contacts the Provider to review any of the Student Data accessed pursuant to the Services, the Provider shall refer the parent or individual to the LEA, who will follow the necessary and proper procedures regarding the requested information.
- 3. <u>Separate Account</u>. If pupil generated content is stored or maintained by the Provider as part of the Services described in <u>Exhibit</u> "A", Provider shall, at the request of the LEA, transfer said pupil generated content to a separate student account upon termination of the Service Agreement; provided, however, such transfer shall only apply to pupil generated content that is severable from the Service.
- 4. Third Party Request. Should a Third Party, including law enforcement and government entities, contact Provider with a request for data held by the Provider pursuant to the Services, the Provider shall redirect the Third Party to request the data directly from the LEA. Provider shall notify the LEA as soon as possible in advance of a compelled disclosure to a Third Party of data held by Provider pursuant to the Services, except where such notification may be prohibited by law.
- **5.** <u>Subprocessors</u>. Provider shall enter into written agreements with all Subprocessors performing functions pursuant to the Service Agreement, whereby the Subprocessors agree to protect Student Data in manner consistent with the terms of this DPA, as well as state and federal law.

## ARTICLE III: DUTIES OF LEA

- 1. <u>Privacy Compliance</u>. LEA shall provide data for the purposes of the Service Agreement in compliance with all applicable state and Federal laws and regulations pertaining to data privacy and security, including applicable provisions of FERPA, COPPA, PPRA, and applicable Wisconsin law.
- **2.** <u>Annual Notification of Rights</u>. The LEA shall include a specification of criteria under FERPA for determining who constitutes a school official and what constitutes a legitimate educational interest in its Annual notification of rights.
- 3. <u>Reasonable Precautions</u>. LEA shall take reasonable precautions to secure usernames, passwords, and any other means of gaining access to the services and hosted data.
- **4.** <u>Unauthorized Access Notification</u>. LEA shall notify Provider promptly of any known or suspected unauthorized access to the Services and hosted data. LEA will assist Provider in any efforts by Provider to investigate and respond to any unauthorized access.

#### ARTICLE IV: DUTIES OF PROVIDER

- 1. <u>Privacy Compliance</u>. The Provider shall comply with all applicable state and federal laws and regulations pertaining to data privacy and security, including applicable provisions of FERPA, COPPA, PPRA, and applicable Wisconsin law, in connection with performance of the Services.
- 2. <u>Authorized Use</u>. The Student Data shared pursuant to the Service Agreement, including persistent unique identifiers, shall be used for no purpose other than the Services stated in the Service Agreement and/or otherwise authorized under the statutes referred to in subsection (1), above.
- 3. <u>Employee Obligation</u>. Provider shall require all employees and agents who have access to Student Data to comply with all applicable provisions of this DPA with respect to the Student Data shared under the Service Agreement.
- **4.** <u>No Disclosure</u>. Provider shall not copy, reproduce or transmit any Student Data obtained under the Service Agreement and/or any portion thereof, except as necessary to fulfill the Service Agreement or as expressly authorized under this DPA.
- 5. <u>Disposition of Data</u>. Upon written request and in accordance with the applicable terms in subsection a or b, below, Provider shall dispose of or delete all Personally Identifiable Information in Student Data obtained under the Service Agreement when it is no longer needed for the purpose for which it was obtained and subject to subsection b below. Disposition shall include (1) the shredding of any hard copies of any Personally Identifiable Information; (2) erasing; or (3) otherwise modifying the Personally Identifiable Information in those records to make it unreadable or indecipherable by human or digital means. Nothing in the Service Agreement authorizes Provider to maintain Personally Identifiable Information in Student Data obtained under the Service Agreement beyond the time period reasonably needed to complete the disposition. Provider shall provide written notification to LEA when the Personally Identifiable Information in Student Data has been disposed. The duty to dispose of Personally Identifiable

Information in Student Data shall not extend to data that has been de-identified or placed in a separate Student account, pursuant to the other terms of the DPA. The LEA may employ a "Request for Return or Deletion of Student Data" form, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit "D". Upon receipt of a request from the LEA, the Provider will immediately provide the LEA with any specified portion of the Student Data within ten (10) calendar days of receipt of said request, as may be consistent with the functionality of the Services and provided that if LEA makes such a request while the Service Agreement is still in effect, Provider will not be responsible for the impact of such request on Provider's ability to provide the Services.

- a. Partial Disposal During Term of Service Agreement. Throughout the Term of the Service Agreement, LEA may request partial disposal of Student Data obtained under the Service Agreement that is no longer needed to provide the Services and where such Student Data is severable from other Student Data as consistent with the normal functionality of the Service. Partial disposal of data shall be subject to LEA's request to transfer data to a separate account, pursuant to Article II, section 3, above.
- b. Complete Disposal Upon Termination of Service Agreement. Upon Termination of the Service Agreement without renewal or execution of a follow-on Service Agreement Provider shall dispose or delete all Student Data obtained under the Service Agreement. Prior to disposition of the data, Provider shall notify LEA in writing of its option to transfer data to a separate account, pursuant to Article II, section 3, above. In no event shall Provider dispose of data pursuant to this provision unless and until Provider has received affirmative written confirmation from LEA that data will not be transferred to a separate account. Provider will not be responsible for any delay by LEA in delivering such written confirmation.
- 6. Advertising Prohibition. Provider is prohibited from using or selling Student Data to (a) market or advertise to students or families/guardians; (b) inform, influence, or enable marketing, advertising, or other commercial efforts by a Provider; (c) develop a profile of a student, family member/guardian or group, for any commercial purpose other than providing the Service to LEA; or (d) use the Student Data for the development of commercial products or services, other than as necessary to provide the Service to LEA, including where such development benefits other Provider customers. This section does not prohibit Provider from using Student Data for adaptive learning or customized student learning purposes.

### **ARTICLE V: DATA PROVISIONS**

- 1. <u>Data Security</u>. The Provider agrees to abide by and maintain adequate data security measures, consistent with industry standards and industry best practices, to protect Student Data from unauthorized disclosure or acquisition by an unauthorized person. The general security duties of Provider are set forth below. Provider may further detail its security programs and measures in <u>Exhibit "F"</u> hereto. These measures shall include, but are not limited to:
  - a. Passwords and Employee Access. Provider shall secure usernames, passwords, and any other means of gaining access to the Services or to Student Data, at a level suggested by the applicable standards, as set forth in Article 4.3 of NIST 800-63-3. Provider shall only provide access to Student Data to employees or contractors that are performing the Services. Employees with access to Student Data shall have signed confidentiality agreements regarding said Student Data. All employees with access to

Student Data shall be subject to criminal background checks in compliance with state and local ordinances.

- b. Destruction of Data. Provider shall destroy or delete all Student Data obtained under the Service Agreement when it is no longer needed for the purpose for which it was obtained, or transfer said data to LEA or, where such transfer is permitted by law, LEA's designee, according to the procedure identified in Article IV, section 5, above. Nothing in the Service Agreement authorizes Provider to maintain Student Data beyond the time period reasonably needed to complete the disposition.
- c. Security Protocols. Both parties agree to maintain security protocols that meet industry standards in the transfer or transmission of any data, including ensuring that data may only be viewed or accessed by parties legally allowed to do so. Provider shall maintain all Student Data obtained or generated pursuant to the Service Agreement in a secure digital environment and not copy, reproduce, or transmit such data obtained pursuant to the Service Agreement, except as necessary to fulfill the purpose of data requests by LEA and as expressly authorized under this DPA.
- **d. Employee Training.** The Provider shall provide periodic security training to those of its employees who operate or have access to the system. Further, Provider shall provide LEA with contact information of an employee who LEA may contact if there are any security concerns or questions.
- e. Security Technology. When the Service is accessed using a supported web browser, Provider shall employ industry standard measures to protect data from unauthorized access. The service security measures shall include server authentication and data encryption. Provider shall host data pursuant to the Service Agreement in an environment using a firewall that is updated according to industry standards.
- f. Security Coordinator. If different from the designated representative identified in Article VIII, section 5, Provider shall provide the name and contact information of Provider's Security Coordinator for the Student Data received pursuant to the Service Agreement.
- g. Subprocessors Bound. Provider shall enter into written agreements whereby Subprocessors agree to secure and protect Student Data in a manner consistent with the terms of this Article V. Provider shall periodically conduct or review compliance monitoring and assessments of Subprocessors to determine their compliance with this Article.
- **h. Periodic Risk Assessment.** Provider further acknowledges and agrees to conduct digital and physical periodic risk assessments and remediate any identified security and privacy vulnerabilities in a timely manner.
- 2. <u>Data Breach</u>. In the event that LEA becomes aware that Student Data is accessed or obtained by an unauthorized individual, Provider shall provide notification to LEA as soon as reasonably practicable following the incident. Provider shall follow the following process:
  - a. The security breach notification shall be written in plain language, shall be titled "Notice of Data Breach," and shall present the information described herein under the

following headings: "What Happened," "What Information Was Involved," "What We Are Doing," "What You Can Do," and "For More Information." Additional information may be provided as a supplement to the notice.

- **b.** The security breach notification described above in section 2(a) shall include, at a minimum, the following information:
  - i. The name and contact information of the reporting LEA subject to this section.
  - ii. A list of the types of personal information that were or are reasonably believed to have been the subject of a breach.
  - iii. If the information is possible to determine at the time the notice is provided, then either (1) the date of the breach, (2) the estimated date of the breach, or (3) the date range within which the breach occurred. The notification shall also include the date of the notice.
  - iv. Whether the notification was delayed because of a law enforcement investigation, if that information is possible to determine at the time the notice is provided.
  - v. A general description of the breach incident, if that information is possible to determine at the time the notice is provided.
- **c.** At LEA's discretion, the security breach notification may also include any of the following:
  - i. Information about what the agency has done to protect individuals whose information has been breached.
  - ii. Advice on steps that the person whose information has been breached may take to protect himself or herself.
- **d.** Provider agrees to adhere to all requirements in applicable state and federal law with respect to a data breach related to the Student Data, including, when required, the required responsibilities and procedures for notification and mitigation of any such data breach.
- e. Provider further acknowledges and agrees to have a written incident response plan that reflects industry best practices and is consistent with industry standards and federal and state law for responding to a data breach, breach of security, privacy incident or unauthorized acquisition or use of Student Data or any portion thereof, including Personally Identifiable Information and agrees to provide LEA, upon request, with a copy of said written incident response plan.
- f. Except if required by law, Provider is prohibited from directly contacting parent, legal guardian or eligible pupil of a data breach regarding their Student Data unless expressly requested by LEA. If LEA requests Provider's assistance providing notice of unauthorized access, and such assistance is not unduly burdensome to Provider, Provider shall notify the affected parent, legal guardian or eligible pupil of the unauthorized access, which shall include the information listed in subsections (b) and (c), above. If requested by LEA, Provider shall reimburse LEA for costs incurred to notify parents/families of a data breach originating from Provider's breach of this DPA.
- g. In the event of a breach originating from LEA's use of the Service, Provider shall cooperate with LEA (at LEA's expense) to the extent necessary to expeditiously secure Student Data.

## ARTICLE VI- GENERAL OFFER OF PRIVACY TERMS

Provider may, by signing the attached Form of General Offer of Privacy Terms (General Offer, attached hereto as <u>Exhibit</u> "E"), be bound by the terms of this DPA to any other LEA who signs the acceptance on in said Exhibit. The Form is limited by the terms and conditions described therein.

## ARTICLE VII: EXCLUSION OF DAMAGES/LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

- 1. EXCLUSION OF CERTAIN DAMAGES. NEITHER PARTY WILL BE LIABLE TO THE OTHER PARTY FOR ANY INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, CONSEQUENTIAL, SPECIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THIS AGREEMENT, EVEN IF A PARTY HAS BEEN ADVISED OF THE POSSIBILITY OF SUCH DAMAGES OR IF SUCH POSSIBILITY WAS REASONABLY FORESEEABLE.
- 2. <u>LIMITATION ON LIABILITY</u>. IN NO EVENT WILL PROVIDER'S TOTAL AGGREGATE LIABILITY FOR ALL CLAIMS ARISING OUT OF OR IN CONNECTION WITH THIS AGREEMENT EXCEED THE TOTAL AMOUNTS ACTUALLY PAID BY LEA TO PROVIDER UNDER THIS AGREEMENT.
- 3. <u>APPLICATION</u>. THE EXCLUSION OF DAMAGES AND LIMITATION ON LIABILITY IN THIS SECTION SHALL APPLY REGARDLESS OF THE FORM OR CAUSE OF ACTION OR THE ALLEGED BASIS OF ANY CLAIM AND EVEN IF THE REMEDIES OTHERWISE PROVIDED UNDER THIS AGREEMENT AT LAW OR IN EQUITY FAIL OF THEIR ESSENTIAL PURPOSE.

#### ARTICLE VIII: MISCELLANEOUS

- 1. <u>Term</u>. Each party shall be bound by this DPA for the duration of the Service Agreement or so long as the Provider maintains any Student Data.
- 2. <u>Termination</u>. In the event that either party seeks to terminate this DPA, they may do so by mutual written consent so long as the Service Agreement has lapsed or has been terminated. LEA shall have the right to terminate the DPA and Service Agreement in the event of a material breach of the terms of this DPA by Provider that remains uncured thirty days following written notice from LEA to Provider thereof.
- 3. <u>Effect of Termination Survival</u>. If the Service Agreement is terminated, the Provider shall destroy all of LEA's data pursuant to Article V, section 1(b), and Article II, section 3, above.
- **4.** <u>Priority of Agreements</u>. This DPA shall govern the treatment of Student Data in order to comply with privacy protections, including those found in FERPA and all applicable privacy statutes identified in this DPA. In the event there is conflict between the DPA and the Service Agreement, the DPA shall apply and take precedence. Except as described in this paragraph herein, all other provisions of the Service Agreement shall remain in effect.
- 5. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or other communication required or permitted to be given hereunder must be in writing and given by personal delivery, or e-mail transmission (if contact information is

provided for the specific mode of delivery), or first-class mail, postage prepaid, sent to the designated representatives before:

6. Entire Agreement. This DPA, together with the Services Agreement, constitutes the entire agreement of the parties relating to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior communications, representations, or agreements, oral or written, by the parties relating thereto. This DPA may be amended and the observance of any provision of this DPA may be waived (either generally or in any particular instance and either retroactively or prospectively) only with the signed written consent of both parties. Neither failure nor delay on the part of any party in exercising any right, power, or privilege hereunder shall operate as a waiver of such right, nor shall any single or partial exercise of any such right, power, or privilege preclude any further exercise thereof or the exercise of any other right, power, or privilege.

- 7. Severability. Any provision of this DPA that is prohibited or unenforceable in any jurisdiction shall, as to such jurisdiction, be ineffective to the extent of such prohibition or unenforceability without invalidating the remaining provisions of this DPA, and any such prohibition or unenforceability in any jurisdiction shall not invalidate or render unenforceable such provision in any other jurisdiction. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if such provision could be more narrowly drawn so as not to be prohibited or unenforceable in such jurisdiction while, at the same time, maintaining the intent of the parties, it shall, as to such jurisdiction, be so narrowly drawn without invalidating the remaining provisions of this DPA or affecting the validity or enforceability of such provision in any other jurisdiction.
- 8. Governing Law; Venue and Jurisdiction. THIS DPA WILL BE GOVERNED BY AND CONSTRUED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN, WITHOUT REGARD TO CONFLICTS OF LAW PRINCIPLES. EACH PARTY CONSENTS AND SUBMITS TO THE SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE JURISDICTION TO THE STATE AND FEDERAL COURTS FOR THE COUNTY IN WHICH THIS AGREEMENT IS FORMED FOR ANY DISPUTE ARISING OUT OF OR RELATING TO THIS SERVICE AGREEMENT OR THE TRANSACTIONS CONTEMPLATED HEREBY.
- 9. <u>Authority</u>. Provider represents that it is authorized to bind to the terms of this Agreement, including confidentiality and destruction of Student Data and any portion thereof contained therein.
- 10. Waiver. No delay or omission of the LEA to exercise any right hereunder shall be construed as a waiver of any such right and the LEA reserves the right to exercise any such right from time to time, as often as may be deemed expedient.
- 11. Force Majeure. Provider will not be liable for any breach of this DPA due to causes beyond Provider's reasonable control including without limitation, acts of God, government action, strikes, acts of public enemies, civil disturbance or riots, war, national emergency, pandemics, floods, power outages, telecommunications failures, fires, earthquakes, storms, or other similar causes.
- 11. Successors Bound. This DPA is and shall be binding upon the respective successors in interest to Provider in the event of a merger, acquisition, consolidation or other business reorganization or sale of all or substantially all of the assets of such business.

## EXHIBIT "C"

#### **DEFINITIONS**

**De-Identifiable Information (DII):** De-Identification refers to the process by which the Provider removes or obscures any Personally Identifiable Information ("PII") from student records in a way that removes or minimizes the risk of disclosure of the identity of the individual and information about them.

Educational Records: Educational Records are official records, files and data directly related to a student and maintained by the school or local education agency, including but not limited to, records encompassing all the material kept in the student's cumulative folder, such as general identifying data, records of attendance and of academic work completed, records of achievement, and results of evaluative tests, health data, disciplinary status, test protocols and individualized education programs. For purposes of this DPA, Educational Records are referred to as Student Data.

NIST: Draft National Institute of Standards and Technology ("NIST") Special Publication Digital Authentication Guideline.

Personally Identifiable Information (PII): The terms "Personally Identifiable Information" or "PII" shall include, as it pertains to the LEA or its users, students or students' parents/guardians, refers to information that is linked or linkable to a specific individual and that alone or in aggregate would allow a reasonable person to identify the individual with reasonable certainty. "PII" may include but are not limited to, student data, metadata, and user or pupil-generated content obtained by reason of the use of Provider's software, website, service, or app, including mobile apps, whether gathered by Provider or provided by LEA or its users, students, or students' parents/guardians. PII includes Indirect Identifiers, which is any information that, either alone or in aggregate, would allow a reasonable person to be able to identify a student to a reasonable certainty. For purposes of this DPA, Personally Identifiable Information shall include the categories of information listed in the definition of Student Data.

**Pupil Generated Content:** The term "pupil-generated content" means materials or content created by an LEA pupil during and for the purpose of education including, but not limited to, essays, research reports, portfolios, creative writing, music or other audio files, photographs, videos, and account information that enables ongoing ownership of pupil content.

**Pupil Records:** Means all of the following: (1) Any information that directly relates to a pupil that is maintained by LEA;(2) any information acquired directly from the pupil through the use of instructional software or applications assigned to the pupil by a teacher or other LEA employee; and any information that meets the definition of a "pupil record" under Wis. Stat. § 118.125(1)(d). For the purposes of this Agreement, Pupil Records shall be the same as Educational Records.

**Service Agreement**: Refers to the Contract or Purchase Order to which this DPA supplements and modifies, as described in the opening paragraph of the recitals to this DPA.

School District Official: For the purposes of this Agreement and pursuant to 34 CFR 99.31 (B) and Wis. Stat. § 118.125(2)(d), a School District Official is a contractor that: (1) Performs an institutional service or function for which the agency or institution would otherwise use employees;

(2) Is under the direct control of the agency or institution with respect to the use and maintenance of education records; and (3) Is subject to 34 CFR 99.33(a) and Wis. Stat. § 118.125(2) governing the use and re-disclosure of Personally Identifiable Information from Pupil Records.

Student Data: Student Data includes any data, whether gathered by Provider or provided by LEA or its users, students, or students' parents/guardians, that is descriptive of the student including, but not limited to, information in the student's educational record or email, first and last name, home address, telephone number, email address, or other information allowing online contact, discipline records, videos, test results, special education data, juvenile dependency records, grades, evaluations, criminal records, medical records, health records, social security numbers, biometric information, disabilities, socioeconomic information, food purchases, political affiliations, religious information text messages, student identifies, search activity, photos, voice recordings or geolocation information. Student Data shall constitute Pupil Records for the purposes of this Agreement, and for the purposes of Wisconsin and federal laws and regulations. Student Data as specified in <a href="Exhibit">Exhibit</a> "B" is confirmed to be collected or processed by the Provider pursuant to the Services. Student Data shall not constitute that information that has been anonymized or de-identified, or anonymous usage data regarding a student's use of Provider's services.

**Subscribing LEA:** An LEA that was not party to the original Services Agreement and who accepts the Provider's General Offer of Privacy Terms, if Provider has executed Exhibit F.

**Subprocessor:** For the purposes of this Agreement, the term "Subprocessor" (sometimes referred to as the "Subcontractor") means a party other than LEA or Provider, who Provider uses for data

collection, analytics, storage, or other service to operate and/or improve its software, and who has access to PII.

Targeted Advertising: Targeted advertising means presenting an advertisement to a student where the selection of the advertisement is based on student information, student records or student generated content or inferred over time from the usage of the Provider's website, online service or mobile application by such student or the retention of such student's online activities or requests over time.

Third Party: The term "Third Party" means an individual or entity that is not a party to this DPA.
